Geomagnetic Storms

• Disturbances in the geomagnetic field caused by gusts in the solar wind that blows by earth.

Solar Radiation Storms

• Elevated levels of radiation that occur when the numbers of energetic particles increase.

• Disturbances of the ionosphere caused by X-ray emissions from the Sun.

Geophysical	Geophysical Activity Forecast: The geomagnetic field is expected to be at quiet to active levels on days one and two (16 May, 17 May) and quiet levels on day three (18 May). Protons are expected to cross threshold on day one (16 May), have a slight chance of crossing threshold on day two (17 May) and have a slight chance of crossing threshold on day three (18 May).
